#### Introduction

This family is one which came to my attention during my searches through the parish registers of Stockingford. I have never been in contact with anyone from this family although, in August 1987, I received a letter from a firm of professional genealogists who had been engaged by an unknown person to trace their Jeffcott ancestry. They had done some work at the GRO and had come to a grinding halt when they searched the census and found the placename of birth for John Jeffcott as 'Wrappershole'. What they wanted to know from me was where this place was, together with anything else that I could tell them. My dilemma was whether to give them the information as they were clearly receiving a fee for their work and would also charge a fee for supplying my information to their client.

I sent them the information, free of charge, with a request to be put in touch with their client. They were pleased to receive a copy of my hard work and requested still more, which I obligingly sent. That was the last that I heard of them, despite a request from me to send their client's information. Their client was the grandson of John William and Rose Jeffcott. I concluded that perhaps I had been too helpful for my own good.

The family tree starts with William Jeffcott who was a labourer of Stockingford. Rappershole is or was a small hamlet within that parish and I wonder whether it is still known in the area. It does not appear on any map that I have seen. I cannot with any certainty take the tree any further back and do not know what results the professionals had.

The family of John and Elizabeth are shown in the 1871 census for Ingleton Fells, Yorkshire (RG10/4252) with John working as a carpenter and as being born in 'Wrappershole', Warwickshire. By the time of the 1881 census, John is a lodger in Kirk Smeaton, Yorkshire whilst Elizabeth is head of the household in Swindon. The reason for this can only be guessed-at!
